

It presents four imaginary snapshots of earth as a prehistoric continent, each contrasting movement featuring a phase in the earth's geological development. Aaron Copland's optimistic Appalachian Spring is a tribute to resilience and the discovery of a new world, while Dvořák's glorious late romantic symphony is threaded with memorable tunes.



YOUNG INSTRUMENTALIST PRIZE

This is an annual opportunity for exceptional Queensland school students to audition in front of a panel of Queensland Symphony Orchestra musicians, with a public performance opportunity, cash prizes and mentoring opportunities available to up to six finalists. The overall winner will have the opportunity to perform as a soloist on stage with Queensland Symphony Orchestra.

ELIGIBILITY

Open to students enrolled in a Queensland secondary school performing on an orchestral instrument (including saxophone) at a minimum standard of AMEB Grade 8.

Audition pieces must be one movement or movements from a standard concerto or work for soloist and orchestra with a minimum time limit of 8 minutes and a maximum time limit of 10 minutes.
