





A concerto is typically a piece of music for solo instrument and orchestra, but in Beethoven's Triple Concerto, he gave the solo part to three instruments: violin, cello and piano. This Concerto is grand and beautiful and a great way to open this 250th anniversary year of Beethoven's birth. It will be performed by three brilliant young talents of Australian classical music: Emily Sun, Caleb Wong and Aura Go. There have been debates over whether Shostakovich's spectacular Symphony No.5 was secretly criticising Stalinist Russia. Whatever its hidden messages, it earned a half-hour standing ovation when it was first heard, and we can't wait to wow our audiences with this masterpiece. In this concert we are also delighted to introduce the world to new music by talented Australian composer Melody Eötvös.

There's a beautiful subtlety to the overlap in the timbres and the tessitura of these three instruments that is really exciting to explore. - Alex Miller

We chose the Brahms Piano Quintet because it's one of the greatest of all chamber music pieces. It's in the dramatic key of F minor, and it features Brahms' trademark intensity, passion, relentlessness, power, and sheer muscularity. The French horn is the gorgeous singing instrument of the brass family and there is no more joyous use of the horn than in Richard Strauss' 1st Horn Concerto. That alone would be reason to smile but performed by Stefan Dohr, our guest artist for the evening and Principal Horn of the Berlin Philharmonic, it will be magical. The melodies will continue as Australian conductor Benjamin Northey leads us in the grand finale of the evening: Saint-Saëns' mighty 'Organ' Symphony. The main theme is famous from its appearance in the movie Babe, and in its original format it's an exhilarating, room-shaking burst of happiness. In case that wasn't enough, we'll also include the cheeky The Sorcerer's Apprentice.

The story goes that an early listener to Mozart's Symphony No.41 heard the opening flourishes and was reminded of the Roman god Jupiter and his thunderbolts. The name stuck, and this symphony, one of the greatest pieces of orchestral music ever written, has been known as the Jupiter Symphony ever since. Featured alongside this classical masterpiece will be Britten's gorgeous Les Illuminations, performed by Australian soprano, Emma Pearson. Recently returned from a 10-year stint wowing audiences in Germany, she is sure to melt the hearts of Queensland music-lovers. Saturday evening audiences will hear another famous work with a nickname: Schubert's 'Unfinished' Symphony – unfinished because Schubert died before completing it. Amazingly it's perfect as it is. Friday morning audiences will hear the dramatic overture to Mozart's Don Giovanni.

An unlikely arrangement that is surprisingly effective and complete. Some of the best bits of the opera and you don't feel like you're missing anything. Who needs opera singers when you've got bassoons? It's extremely fun to play! - Nicole Tait

Unlike the traditional piano trio for violin, cello and piano, Weber wrote this specifically with the flute sonority in mind. In this instance we chose to substitute the cello part for the bassoon. A rare and satisfying combination in which each instrument has an equally important and expressive role to play. This trio is a substantial work, arguably one of Weber's best chamber works.- Nicole Tait



When cellist Narek Hakhnazaryan debuted with the Los Angeles Philharmonic, the LA Times said 'his command of the instrument is extraordinary'. He has also been described as 'dazzlingly brilliant' (The Strad) and 'nothing short of magnificent' (San Francisco Chronicle). You'll see why in this amazing concert featuring two major works for cello. A theme and variations consists of a series of variations on a simple tune (like Tchaikovsky's beautiful Variations on a Rococo Theme) but in the hands of Richard Strauss, the cello and orchestra will conjure up the famous story of Don Quixote, the nobleman who deludes himself into thinking he is a knight. Also featured will be either Haydn's Symphony No. 104 or Beethoven's Egmont Overture, conducted by audience favourite Giancarlo Guerrero.



Tickets will be allocated in date order of receipt, prioritised as follows: renewals without seating changes, renewals with changes, new subscriptions. Seats are subject to availability. Your credit card will be debited or your cheque banked on receipt of your subscription application. This establishes priority for your booking within the Queensland Symphony Orchestra's ticketing system. Cash payments can be made at the QSO Box Office. For orders received in August, September or October you can expect to receive your tickets in November 2019. For orders received after these months, tickets will be posted within 5 working days of receipt of your booking. It can take 7 working days for your tickets to reach you via Australia Post. Tickets will be posted to the primary contact listed on the booking form.

PAYING BY INSTALMENT

If paying by credit card, payment for your subscription can be split over two instalments. Queensland Symphony Orchestra will take half of the cost of your booking, plus deferment fee of \$7, transaction fee and any donation, upon receipt of your booking. Please note that your second instalment will automatically be deducted on Monday 2 December 2019 without further notice from Queensland Symphony Orchestra. When paying in instalments your tickets will be posted to you after the final payment is taken.

WITH RENEWABLE SEATS

If you were a Maestro 10-pack, Maestro 12-pack, Morning Masterworks 5-pack or Music on Sundays 5-pack subscriber Queensland Symphony Orchestra Box Office has already reserved you the same seats you had in 2019 for the 2020 Season. We have also reserved seats for Chamber Player set series subscribers. In order to retain these seats you must renew by Wednesday 18 September 2019. After this date your seats will be released for sale. Seating change requests must be made at the time of renewing. Changes, where possible, will be made in date order of receipt. Where it is not possible to satisfy a change request, the original seats will be allocated.

NEW SUBSCRIBERS

Payment for new subscriptions will be taken upon receipt of your order. Seats will be allocated in date order of receipt and only once the renewing subscriber priority period ends on Wednesday 18 September 2019.

SUBSCRIBER TICKET **EXCHANGE BENEFIT**

If you are unable to attend a performance in your subscription package you may exchange your ticket to another performance. To complete an exchange, tickets must be returned to the Queensland Symphony Orchestra Box Office either in person or by post no later than two working days before the affected concert. Subscriber ticket exchanges cannot be completed at QPAC or any other venue. Ticket exchanges are subject to availability.

TICKET EXCHANGE FEES

Subscribers will not be charged for the first three ticket exchanges. Subscribers will be charged an exchange fee of \$4 on their fourth ticket exchange to another concert or choice of seat and for any further exchanges. If the ticket being exchanged is more expensive than the original ticket price, you will need to pay the difference in price plus a \$4 exchange fee per ticket. If the ticket being exchanged is less expensive than the purchased ticket price, a \$4 exchange fee will be incurred and you will not be refunded the difference in ticket value.


