





OSO COMPOSE PROGRAM 2026 - GENERAL INFORMATION

BACKGROUND

Queensland Symphony Orchestra invites secondary school students from across Queensland to participate in the 2026 Compose Program. The Compose Program is run through QSO's Community and Education department (QSO Connect) and is designed to introduce secondary school students to composing for orchestral instruments, extending learning in the senior phase of their schooling beyond the general requirements of the curriculum.

Through workshops and face-to-face activities under the guidance of QSO Composition Mentors <u>Craig Allister Young</u> and <u>Timothy Tate</u>, program participants have the opportunity to write compositions for the QSO Connect Ensemble, a selection of QSO musicians. The program culminates in a final presentation at the QSO Studio in South Bank, Brisbane.

In 2026, 16 spots will be available in the program. Students must apply on an individual basis (independent of their school). This is an intensive program where applicants are expected to manage their workload and meet key deadlines. It offers insight into the professional practice of a composer and a chance for participants to develop core skills for working to industry standards. Therefore, this program should be considered if an applicant is progressing at a high level in Composition/Music and is seeking additional experience outside of the classroom.

APPLICATION PROCESS

Those wishing to apply to the 2026 QSO Compose Program will need to **complete an application form** and submit at least **1 minute of original composed material written for an orchestra**. The application form is now accessible via this link. The form will also be available on the Queensland Symphony Orchestra website. The form will close at 5pm on Friday 14 November 2025. The original composed material can be a piece that the applicant has already written. Past participants are encouraged to apply however; they are unable to submit any previous compositions created in the QSO Compose Program. Applicants are strongly encouraged to showcase their proficiencies in composing for all orchestral instruments and their confidence in utilising their chosen composition software. After completing the application form, applicants must provide all 3 of the following files of their original composed material:

- MuseScore OR Sibelius file:
- PDF file of the full score;
- MP3 file of their composition (an export tutorial is included in the application form)

APPLICATION CRITERIA

Applicants must meet all of the following criteria:

- Be enrolled in year 7-12 in a Queensland secondary school (or home school) in 2026.
- Be able to attend **all** workshop sessions, rehearsals (including specified in-person only rehearsals) and the final presentation.
- Confidently use **MuseScore** or **Sibelius** software and have access to a laptop.
- Complete the <u>application form</u> (also available at <u>www.qso.com.au/education/programs/compose-program)</u>

- Submit 1 minute (minimum) of original composed material for orchestra in 3 formats (see "Compose Program Checklist" below) 5pm on Friday 14 November 2025.
- Regional students are encouraged to apply as online participation for workshops is possible. Please note that attendance is required in person for the specified rehearsals and final presentation.
- Previous participants of the QSO Compose program wishing to reapply are welcome to do so, however are unable to submit any previous compositions created in the QSO Compose program. This is to ensure that the participant remains unidentifiable in the application process.

PROGRAM THEME

In 2026, successful QSO Compose Program participants will be asked to write compositions inspired by visual artist Arabella Walker's work. This artwork will depict landscapes/elements. Participants will have the opportunity to meet Arabella and discuss her work and artistic ethos in person during Workshop 1.

Meet OSO Mentors and Arabella Walker, discuss program outline, Workshop 1 & 2 and inspiration tools. Discussions around orchestration techniques

such as; phrasing, range, bowing, articulations, dynamics.

Workshop 3 Further workshopping orchestration techniques.

Workshop 4 Editing techniques for professional orchestras and preparing drafts. Developing ideas post QSO musician read through, responding to Workshop 5

feedback.

Workshop 6 Final touches before submission.

The QSO Studio is located at 114 Grey Street, inside the ABC Building. The building entrance is at the end of Russell Street, near the Wheel of Brisbane. Participants should allow 15 minutes to sign into the building with ABC Security, prior to each workshop.

- 2026 Compose Program participants will receive 2 complimentary tickets to the final presentation.
- These 2 tickets will be distributed at the last workshop on Mon 27 July.
- Participants are responsible for distributing their 2 complimentary tickets to guests.
- QSO is not responsible if participants misplace their 2 complimentary tickets.
- There is no assigned seating, the QSO Studio is General Admission.
- Compose participants do not require a ticket for themselves.
- Any additional guests who wish to attend the Final Presentation will be required to purchase a ticket to the Final Presentation.
- Participants will be informed when tickets will go on sale for the Final Presentation.

PROGRAM CONDITIONS:

Participation in this program is reliant upon attendance at ALL listed workshops, rehearsal and presentation dates. Sessions are not recorded and notes are not provided. Queensland Symphony Orchestra reserves the right to remove a participant from the Compose Program at any time during the application or program phase if any submitted composed material is proven to be plagiarized, AI Generated or appropriated. Due to the nature of score preparation, submission deadlines must be strictly observed. Failure observe submission deadlines will result in the last known draft of a participant's composition being submitted to QSO Mentors for review.
