# ABOUT QUEENSLAND SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA

Queensland's orchestral history began in 1871 with violinist R.T. Jefferies, but it wasn't until 1947 that the state established its own professional symphony orchestra. This orchestra, Australia's second, was created through a partnership between the Australian Broadcasting Commission, the Queensland Government, and Brisbane City Council. The 45-member Queensland Symphony Orchestra debuted on 26 March 1947 at Brisbane City Hall, playing to 2,500 attendees with guest conductor Percy Code and pianist Eunice Gardiner. The program included works by Wagner, Grieg, Berlioz, and Tchaikovsky.

In its first year, the orchestra performed 31 concerts and started an annual tour of North Queensland, heralding a new era in Queensland's musical landscape.



# IF YOU'RE NEW TO THE ORCHESTRA



# WHO SITS WHERE

Orchestras sit in sections based on types of instruments. There are four main sections in the symphony orchestra (strings, woodwinds, brass, and percussion) and sometimes a keyboard section.

#### **STRINGS**

These instruments produce sound by bowing or plucking stretched strings.

First and Second Violin

Viola

Cello

Double Bass

Harp

#### WOODWIND

Wind instruments produce sound by being blown into.

Flute/Piccolo

Clarinet/E-flat Clarinet/Bass Clarinet

Oboe/Cor Anglais

Bassoon/Contrabassoon

#### WHO'S ON STAGE TODAY

#### **KEYBOARD**

Keyboard instruments are played by pressing keys.

Celeste

Organ

#### **BRASS**

Brass players create sound by vibrating their lips. When this vibration is pushed through large brass tubes, it can create significant noise.

French Horn

Trumpet

Trombone/Bass Trombone

Tuba

#### **PERCUSSION**

These instruments create sound by being struck or, for the harp, plucked or strummed. Some instruments just make a sound; others play particular notes.

Timpani, Bass drum, Snare drum, Cymbals, Glockenspiel, Xylophone, Vibraphone, Tam-tam, Triangle, Sleigh Bells.

# LISTENING GUIDE

#### Glinka - Overture to Ruslan and Ludmila

Mikhail Glinka's Overture to *Ruslan and Ludmila* is a thrilling and energetic orchestral piece that captures the adventurous spirit of the opera based on Pushkin's epic poem. The overture opens with a rapid burst of strings, instantly setting a lively and playful mood. The main theme, a buoyant melody introduced by the strings and echoed by woodwinds, embodies the excitement of Ruslan's quest to rescue Ludmila.

This overture is celebrated for its technical brilliance, showcasing the orchestra's virtuosity and setting the stage for the operatic adventure to follow.

### Westlake - Flying Dream Suite for Orchestra from the movie Paper Planes

Nigel Westlake's Flying Dream Suite for Orchestra is a captivating work drawn from his score for the film Paper Planes. The suite captures the spirit of youthful ambition and the magic of flight, reflecting the movie's themes of creativity, resilience, and the joy of following one's dreams.

Westlake's music combines lush orchestral textures, sweeping melodies, and rhythmic drive to evoke a sense of wonder and freedom. The suite's vibrant orchestration and uplifting themes transport the listener, mirroring the exhilarating journey of the film's young protagonist. It's a beautifully crafted piece that resonates with both whimsy and emotional depth.

## Dean - Symphony No.3 'The Great Barrier Reef'

Paul Dean's Symphony No. 3 'The Great Barrier Reef' is a powerful, evocative work that reflects the beauty, fragility, and urgency surrounding one of the world's most iconic natural wonders. Dean, an Australian composer and clarinettist, uses the symphony to convey the grandeur and environmental challenges facing the reef, blending traditional symphonic elements with modern influences.

## Dvořák - Symphony No.8 in G, Op. 88

This symphony is known for its cheerful melodies, rich orchestration, and folk-inspired themes. The first movement opens with a gentle theme, evolving into lively dance-like rhythms. The second movement is serene and reflective, with song-like melodies. The third movement offers a graceful, playful waltz. The symphony concludes with a bold, triumphant finale featuring a dramatic fanfare and vibrant variations. Listen for Dvořák's lush orchestration, folk influences, and uplifting spirit throughout.

# Vladimir Fanshil Conductor

Ukrainian-born Australian conductor Vladimir Fanshil is celebrated for his precision, musicianship, and strong international ties with major orchestras. He regularly conducts the Bilkent Symphony Orchestra in Turkey and the Odessa Philharmonic and Opera in Ukraine. Fanshil's global engagements include appearances with prestigious ensembles like the Orchestre National d'Ile de France, Konzerthaus Orchestra Berlin, and the Budapest Festival Orchestra. He also directed the Debut to Master series at the St. Petersburg Philharmonic and served as a guest conductor at the Mariinsky Theatre.

Fanshil's career was shaped by mentorship under Iván Fischer, assisting with world-renowned orchestras like the Berlin Philharmonic. In Australia, he has worked with Opera Australia and conducted over 50 performances with his live music initiative, Live at Yours, launched during the pandemic to bring intimate, salon-style concerts to new audiences.

Fanshil combines artistic talent with entrepreneurial skills, excelling in concert programming and audience engagement. His passion lies in igniting a love for classical music, especially among young listeners, making him a dynamic force in the classical music world.



# Ashleigh Denning Host

Ashleigh Denning is a dynamic and captivating performer, boasting more than 20 years experience in live performance. She graduated as a recipient of the Award for Excellence for her Bachelor of Musical Theatre (2016) at the Queensland Conservatorium Griffith University; where she continued on to complete a Master of Music Studies: Vocal Pedagogy (2021).

Ashleigh has also performed at the Lord Mayor's Christmas Carols, Bleach Festival, Opera in the Gardens, and Outback Queensland Masters. She is a sought-after event singer and regular entertainer on P&O Cruises with her band, CopperTop, and resident soprano for the Underground Opera Company's West End To Broadway seasons. As a teacher, Ashleigh helps budding performers find their voice through her extensive training and experience.



Queensland's state orchestra, QSO, is making a significant investment in regional Queensland by providing education and large-scale community concerts every year until 2028.

Touring Queensland as a full orchestra comprising over 60 musicians, QSO will travel to four major cities and one outback location annually, inviting schools and communities from neighbouring areas to travel to hear the orchestra. This Residency Model ensures that thousands of regional and remote Queenslanders are given an opportunity to experience their state orchestra live.

This locally-led approach works with multiple stakeholders: Arts Queensland, regional mayors, councils, economic development agencies, local leaders, local festivals and events, businesses (SME and corporate), state tourism bodies and philanthropists. The multi-year strategy aims to maximise community-wide engagement, and assess the economic, social and educational impact of QSO in Queensland communities.
